February Meeting Review

John Jones "Brynore (Bryn oer) Tram Road".

John gave us a very interesting and well-illustrated history of the tramroad which linked Trefil quarry at the head of the Monmouthshire Valleys with the Brecon and Abergavenny Canal (today called the Monmouth and Brecon Canal) at Talybont on Usk. He had many interesting documents which he gave the audience an opportunity to study.

This includes a history of the tramroad and some excellent illustrations.

The Great and the Good

On 10 October 1874, missionary Dr. Robert Moffat gave a lecture at the Glamorgan Street Chapel in Brecon. The following year, Rev Roger Price, a local missionary from Upper Chapel, also gave a lecture at the Glamorgan Street Chapel. Dr. Moffat's daughter, Mary née Moffat, married Dr. David Livingstone. Another of Dr Moffat's daughters, Elizabeth Lees née Moffat, was Roger Price's second wife. Rev Roger Price's biography is called *Great Lion of Behuanaland: the Life and Times of Roger Price, Missionary*, by Edwin W. Smith.

The Rev Price's second wife's journals, written in Bechuanaland, were published as *The Journals of Elizabeth Lees Price*: by Lees Price, Elizabeth (edited by Una Long), 1854-1883. Useful websites for this topic include:
